Keynote Speakers

Associate Professor Sharon Goldfeld

Associate Professor Sharon Goldfeld's keynote address will focus on how emerging results from the AEDI have highlighted the inequalities in developmental starting points for children in the early years of school. She will also be facilitating two workshops on Using the AEDI to help communities start to plan and evaluate local ECD action for children.

Associate Professor Sharon Goldfeld is a paediatrician at the Royal Children's Hospital's Centre for Community Child Health (CCCH) and Research Fellow at the Murdoch Children's Research Institute. She currently leads the Australian Early Development Index Research Program at CCCH and until recently was the Principal Medical Advisor in the Victorian Department of Education and Early Childhood Development after a decade in state government. She has been the recipient of the prestigious international Harkness Fellowship in Health Care Policy and the Aileen Plant Medal in Public Health Research. Her research focus of developing data and indicators, investigating community based systems change and language and literacy based intervention trials, has aligned with her substantial policy experience focusing on projects that keep child health and development on the policy and political agenda in Victoria and nationally.

Dr Matt Finch

Dr Matt Finch will be speaking on International Early Literacy Models and Trends. He will be drawing heavily on the new research coming out of the big global think tanks. Matt will also be leading a workshop on Early Literacy and Television.

Matt is a British writer and educator who has worked across the age ranges from 4 years to 40 in locations as diverse as the mountains of Peru, the streets of Brooklyn, Shakespeare's birthplace and rural New South Wales. As well as writing for print and online media around the world, Matt works as a community outreach consultant and serves on the advisory board for the New York literacy charity Behind the Book. Dr Lance Emerson

Dr Lance Emerson is the CEO of the Australian Research Alliance for Children and Youth (ARACY). Lance has a background in primary health care and quality improvement, with a focus on 'joined-up' solutions to applying best evidence in addressing health inequities. He has worked in senior Government positions at both the State and Federal level, as a private consultant, as executive of a national member based health organisation, and has been appointed to numerous Ministerial committees and working groups. He is a member of the National Children's Roundtable, the National Child Information Advisory Group of the Australian Government, and is also on the Board of the Climate and Health Alliance. His passion and focus is on progressing collaborative evidence based action to improve the health and wellbeing of young Australians
